What's in a Name?

You're probably not alone if you've ever wondered how we came up with our OACYS name, what it means, how it's pronounced, and why we made this change a few years ago.

Perhaps the most common misconception is that it's the company co-founder's name, and those folks often spell it "Oacy's" and pronounce it something like "Ossie's" or "Ozzie's." But that's not it (and her name is actually spelled "Asih" anyway).

A few years ago we decided that we needed a more global name to better represent our various services on the global Internet stage. We also wanted something unique that would not likely be in use elsewhere, and so could readily be registered at state and federal levels and used for trademarks, copyrights, domains, and so forth.

At the time we had been known locally for nearly 20 years as Olson Computer Services, or "OCS." To make a long story short, we simply spread those letters apart and slipped in a couple of phonetic vowels to create a word that's pronounced as in "oasis."

That led next to the palm tree in our logo, and all the positive images associated with the welcome respite of an oasis surrounded by wastelands.

We still use all of our names interchangeably in the local area, and you'll still hear us answer phones with the familiar "OCS" – but for formal purposes and when doing business out of town we use OACYS TECHNOLOGY exclusively. *So now you know!*

Steering Clear of Phishers

If you received a letter in the mail requesting personal information about your bank account that you'd think they should already have on file, would you just go ahead and respond regardless?

Neither would we, and email is no different. Here's a clip from a recent edition of *Mossberg's Mailbox* in the Wall Street Journal:

Q: I have received an official-looking email from my bank asking me to contact their website to reconfirm some details of my account. But I've read that such emails are often fakes. Should I respond?

A: I wouldn't. Scammers are using a type of fraud called "phishing," in which they send out emails that look very official, right down to the logo and a web link that appears to be legitimate. If the email suggests that providing this information is mandatory or urgent, then go to the company's website using their official address – not the link in the email – to see if they are actually requesting such information ... or call them to verify.

Browser Battles

Here's another recent blurb from *Mossberg's Mailbox*:

Q: My techie friend is urging me to stop using Internet Explorer on my Windows XP computer and switch to a web browser called "Firefox." He says it's better and more secure.

A: Firefox is a web browser that is a popular alternative to Microsoft's Internet Explorer (IE). It comes from an open-source organization called Mozilla (www.mozilla.org) and is offered in versions for Windows, Macintosh, and Linux. It is more modern than IE, and features tabbed browsing, an approach I like a lot that lets you open multiple websites on a single screen.

Only a small percentage of web surfers use Firefox, but that number is growing sharply in the wake of ongoing warnings that IE's security holes are making it easier for viruses, spyware, and other



malicious software to enter a computer. Microsoft has fixed some of these problems in the new SP2 update (see our October 2004 Newsletter), but Firefox has a number of characteristics that still make it inherently safer than IE.

If you're concerned about security, Firefox is a good way to go – but there are a few downsides. For one thing, it's not finished and is still a preview release. And, there are some websites it doesn't handle properly, because the developers of those sites have tailored them to use features specific to IE. But it's stable and fast, and you can always use IE for those few sites that Firefox doesn't render correctly.

Comments: We're currently using and testing Firefox internally at OCS, with positive results so far. Once we're sufficiently confident and are able to assist with support issues, we'll make a recommendation and will start including it on our setup CDs.
